RESOLUTION 014-24 UNION HEIGHTS SUBDIVISION SEWER DISTRICT TAP and SERVICE AGREEMENT

The undersigned, being (owner) ______ (agent) ______ of property located at the connection address above does hereby request a permit to install a residential sewer line and connection to the Union Heights Subdivision Sewer System (UHSSS).

In consideration of the granting of this permit, the undersigned agrees:

1.) To notify the Union Heights Subdivision Sewer System administrators at the office of the Ross County Commissioners for inspection (740-702-3085):

a.) When the footer drain is installed, both inside and outside, prior to backfilling.

NOTICE*** No surface water from roof drains, foundation drains or basement sumps will be allowed in the buildings sanitary sewer. b.) **24** Hours before the lateral sewer line is complete and ready for connection to the public sewer, but before any of the work is backfilled. If any portion of the work is covered prior to the county's inspection, you will be required to reopen the lateral for inspection at the owner or his/her contractor's expense.

c.) After the building is complete but prior to occupancy and/or real estate closing.

2.) To accept and abide by all provisions of the UHSSS and all other pertinent regulations that may be adopted in the future.

3.) User fees and tap fees are charges for the availability of the sewer service and must be paid in full prior to construction. All building and maintenance expenses are to be paid by the applicant, when installing home service lines to the Union Heights Sewer District sewer main lines. Customer offers tender for the following fees and charges required and set forth by the Ross County Board of Commissioners Resolution # 014-24.

Each new connection to the UHSSS's sanitary sewer of any residence, building or other improvement shall include the installation of a shut off or disconnect valve. Such valve shall be a Spears Sewer Disconnect Body, Part Number SDC-040, or approved equal part. Any equal part to such Spears part number shall be identified to the UHSSD in the sanitary sewer construction documents required. Installation of the shutoff valve described above shall be at the property owner's expense. Installation shall also include all the necessary fittings, stand pipe and other appurtenances thereto, and shall be in a manner that provides the district above-ground access to such valve. As a condition of service, the property owner consents to entry by the district on their property to operate the shut off valve, as may be necessary. Authorized employees of the district shall have access to the premises supplied with sewer service to ensure district rules and regulations are observed, to make any necessary examination of sewer equipment, and/or to effect termination of service, including disconnection, in the event the property owner fails to comply with said rules and regulations, or for nonpayment of fees and charges.

RESOLUTION 015-24 IMPLEMENTING A 911 PROGRAM REVIEW COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, Ohio House Bill 33 requires all counties to implement a program review committee to "maintain and amend a final plan for implementing and operating a countywide 911 system (128.06). Ross County shall maintain a county 9-1-1 program review committee, which shall serve without compensation and shall consist of six voting members as follows:

WHEREAS, in accordance with ORC section 128.06(a), counties with more than one PSAP must have the following members on their committee; (1) A member of the board of county commissioners, or a designee, who shall serve as chairperson of the committee;

(2) The chief executive officer of the most populous municipal corporation in the county;

(3) A member of the board of township trustees of the most populous township in the county as selected by majority vote of the board of trustees;

(4) A member of a board of township trustees selected by the majority of boards of township trustees in the county pursuant to resolutions they adopt;

(4) A member of a board of township trustees selected by the majority of boards of township trustees in the county pursuant to resolutions they adopt;
(5) A member of the legislative authority of a municipal corporation in the county selected by the majority of the legislative authorities of municipal corporations in the county pursuant to resolutions they adopt;

(6) An elected official from within the county appointed by the board of county commissioners. When determining population under division 1 86.06(A) (2) of this section, population residing outside the county shall be excluded.

WHEREAS, each committee shall maintain and amend a final plan for implementing and operating a countywide 9-1-1 system. Any amendment to the final plan shall require a two-thirds vote of the committee. Each committee shall convene at least once annually for the purposes of maintaining or amending a final plan and;

BE IT RESOLVED, Each committee shall, not later than the first day of March of each year, submit a report to the political subdivisions within the county and to the 9-1-1 program office detailing the sources and amounts of revenue expended to support and all costs incurred to operate the countywide 9-1-1 system and the public safety answering points that are a part of that system for the previous calendar year. A county shall provide the county's committee with any clerical, legal, and other staff assistance necessary.
